CONFERENCE OBJECTIVES:

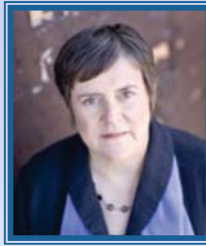
- Laypersons will be inspired to serve thereby expressing their baptismal vows.

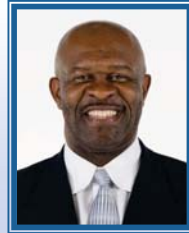

His encompassing expertise has been sought by a numerous national media outlets including NBC, ABC, CBS, CNN, and The Discovery Channel.



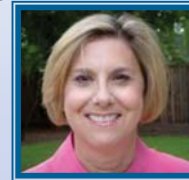
