The focus of SEEK camp is to acknowledge that everyone is special in God's eyes. Campers who are physically, emotionally and or mentally challenged learn about love, friendship, sharing, caring, and living in Christian community. All activities are designed to accommodate the special needs of our campers. Each camper is encouraged and assisted by their counselor to participate in the camp community.

Our Goals:

- To provide a summer church camp opportunity for persons ages 9 to 14 who need special assistance which can't be provided in other camps.
- To provide respite for parents and siblings.
- To provide a humbling and growing experience of Christian community to the staff.

Our Unique Features:

- Ecumenical—many campers come from other denominations.
- Evangelistic—some campers come from unchurched families.
- Missional—campers come from beyond the North Texas Conference; campers come from all over Texas and have come from as far away as Washington State and New York City.
- Inclusive—unlike most special needs camps which group campers according to like conditions, at SEEK camps our only common denominator is our reliance on God's grace.

Staff:

- Camp is directed by a United Methodist Church professional and a person experienced in special education or clinical practice.
- Each cabin has both adult and young adult counselors, all of whom are volunteers.
- Training events are held prior to camps to prepare the staff for working with campers.

- In addition to cabin staff, there are resource persons for music, arts and crafts, and recreation as well as registered nurses.
